District Information— Committee Updates

Curriculum Council:

The April meeting resulted in recommendation to follow through with district wide common writing prompts to be put in place in October and then again in mid March. The entire staff will participate in selecting a topic, providing articles for writing reference, and grading with a rubric. In addition, a change to a traditional math program with a 6-12 vertical alignment is in place. This will align and provide an opportunity for math students to prepare through AP calculus. Furthermore, there will be vertical articulation meetings 3 times a year to help align the core subjects of math, social science, science, and English. Finally PBL training was recommended for the summer of 2018 as we look to implement the system starting with the 2018-2019 school year.


